Why is reading aloud to school-aged kids important?

Here's what your child(ren) may gain from your read-alouds:

Literacy skills

- Improved vocabulary, listening comprehension, phonics, and familiarity with the printed word
- Children can listen at a higher level than what they can read on their own, so read-alouds also make more complex stories and ideas accessible

Love of reading

- Your example shows your child(ren) that reading is important, pleasurable, and valued

Bonding time

- Reading together provides an opportunity to be close to your child(ren) and make memories together
